### IHPM's 4th Annual International Conference "Health & Productivity: the Ultimate Outcome" October 11-13, 2004, JW Desert Ridge Resort & Spa, Scottsdale, AZ

Institute for Health & Productivity Management's Fourth Annual International Conference is designed to provide the most up-to-date research findings and evidence on Health and Productivity Management (HPM) through intensive lecture and case studies. By attending this conference, you will be able to discuss the theory and practice of HPM, identify tools for measurement of health impact on productivity, evaluate the design and implementation of current HPM programs and analyze data on the total costs of health and the value of interventions to improve productivity. Attendees will also be able to discuss building a HPM business case for senior management.

**Day One Monday October 11th** . . . will feature, concurrently, an Academy on Health and Productivity Management for those already progressing along the HPM track and the introductory HPM 101 for those wanting to get started. These sessions will equip attendees with both a grasp of the principles of HPM and some understanding of its practice .

**Day Two Tuesday October 12th** . . . a "mega" day of business leadership discussions, award presentations, special events and broader theme talks -- will set the larger context in which HPM is occurring and provide some shining examples of its successes -- as well as demonstrate the best new tools for making it happen everywhere. This day of stimulation and celebration will end with a reception for all hands.

**Day Three Wednesday October 13th** . . . a "track" day for all the practitioners and specialists in the four domains of HPM -- Health Promotion/Disease Prevention, Care Management, Occupational Health and Disability, Organizational Health and Culture -- with each co-chaired by recognized leaders and teachers in these fields and offering the latest and best knowledge and practice to take back and use on the job.

**Early bird registration** (by June 15th) allows a 15% discount from the member's rate of \$ 495 and non-member's rate of \$ 695. Alternatively, if you are not already a member of IHPM, you may want to take advantage of the already discounted "join and attend" rate of \$ 595. **US Military Rate is \$395**

**Pre-conference events** will include (1) a half-day **Academy for Health and Productivity Management** (\$295; **US Military Rate is \$195**) (the teaching arm of IHPM) providing the knowledge and skills needed to position health and productivity as a key part of human capital management, and (2) a half-day **session of HPM 101** (\$295; **US Military Rate is \$195**), a course that teaches the basic principles and practices of health and productivity management to newcomers in the field.
