#### **Navy and Marine Corps 2003 Command Excellence in Health Promotion Award Recipients Announced**

The Year 2003 recipients of the Navy and Marine Corps Command Excellence in Health Promotion Award were announced on Monday 22 March at the 43<sup>rd</sup> Navy Occupational Health and Preventive Medicine Workshop, held at the Chesapeake Conference Center, Chesapeake, Virginia.

The Gold Star (highest level), Silver Eagle (medium level), and Bronze Anchor (lowest level) awards are given to commands that have met at least the minimum requirements that should be in place for a command Health Promotion Program at each award level.

A total of thirty-two (32) commands received the Year 2003 Command Excellence in Health Promotion Award, including eighteen (18) Gold Star, ten (10) Silver Eagle, three (3) Bronze Anchor, and one (1) Honorable Mention Award.

Recipients of the Gold Star award include: Branch Medical Clinic Atsugi, Branch Medical Clinic Washington Navy Yard, National Naval Medical Center, Naval & Marine Corps Reserve Center St. Louis, Naval Dental Center Mid-Atlantic, Naval Hospital Bremerton, Naval Hospital Lemoore, Naval Hospital Pensacola, Naval Medical Clinic Pearl Harbor, Navy Reserve Center Fargo, Naval Reserve Readiness Command Midwest, US Naval Hospital Roosevelt Roads, US Naval Hospital Rota, US Naval Hospital Yokosuka, US Naval Medical Clinics United Kingdom, USS ENTERPRISE (CVN-65), USS GEORGE WASHINGTON (CVN-73), and USS ABRAHAM LINCOLN (CVN-72).

Silver Eagle award recipients include: Branch Medical Clinic Marine Corps Air Station Yuma, Branch Medical Clinic Mayport, Naval Hospital Jacksonville, Naval Hospital Oak Harbor, Naval & Marine Corps Reserve Center Raleigh, Naval Medical Center Portsmouth, Semper Fit Center Marine Corps Base Quantico, USS BOXER (LHD-4), USS CLEVELAND (LPD-7), and USS JOHN F. KENNEDY (CV-67).

Recipients of the Bronze Anchor award include: Admiral Joel T. Boone Branch Medical Clinic, Naval & Marine Corps Reserve Center Des Moines, and Naval Hospital Charleston.

Branch Medical Clinic Ingleside was the recipient of an Honorable Mention award.
