




# SHARP News

## Sexual Health Performance Criteria

### How is your command doing?

- Does "preventive health care" in your medical operation encompass the sexual health of your patients?
- Does standard practice in your medical command contribute to the prevention of sexually transmitted infections and unplanned pregnancy among your Sailors, Marines and family members?
- Does your medical operation support the national Healthy People 2010 objectives for sexual health?
- How would you measure your organization's performance?



SHARP has developed a **voluntary performance evaluation tool** for use by interested medical commands and commands with medical capabilities. This evaluation tool measures 5 criteria that are actually a sub-set of the SHARP program goals. The criteria are based on selected national Healthy People 2010 objectives and on supporting objectives established by SHARP. Some criteria may not apply to every command. A "Provider Survey" form is included to assist commands with collection of the data.

HP2010 9-5: Increase the proportion of health care providers who provide <b>emergency contraception</b>
HP 2010 25-13: Increase proportion of STD programs that routinely offer <b>Hepatitis B vaccine</b> to all STD clients
HP 2010 25-16: Increase proportion of sexually active <b>females aged 25 and under screened annually for Chlamydia</b>
HP 2010 25-18: Increase proportion of primary care <b>providers</b> who treat STDs IAW recognized standards
(SHARP) Increase proportion of providers who assess sexual risk behavior during routine outpatient encounters
